WEB AND GIS STORIES

Kensington Corridor Trust



With a focus on Climate and Environmental Impact, Hopeworks GIS team partnered with Kensington Corridor Trust to create an Interactive Web Map and Story Map. The maps' geographic footprint is located on Kensington Ave between Lehigh and Glenwood. It contained data layers that can be displayed individually or together such as: Transit, lead data, construction permit data, poverty and census tract data, and purple monitor air quality data.

City of Burlington



The City of Burlington project is a Web Department Project and the largest sale for the department in this FY. Burlington was looking for a more modern website that is accessible and easy to navigate. Their goal was to provide a better user experience, while also being an effective tool for residents, partners, and visitors. In return, Hopeworks created a dynamic and functional website that is also an effective marketing tool. Key functions included compelling visuals, accessibility audit, and a clear call to action.

PHL Tree Inventory & Renewal



The PHL Tree Inventory & Renewal project included our GIS team performing an inventory for the Philadelphia Airport. Our team utilized a GPS-based data collection system to conduct a thorough inventory of the trees on and around the airport property. We will ensure that all necessary data fields, such as species, size, condition, and maintenance recommendations, were accurately recorded and organized in a GIS deliverable. After much success, the airport renewed the contract for \$175,000.




